INVITATION

Southport Yacht Club extends a warm invitation to all owners, skippers and crews of all eligible boats to enter and compete in the 2012 **XXXX** Sail Paradise Regatta to be sailed on Windward/Leeward, Triangle and Ocean Marks Courses on the waters off Main Beach and Surfers Paradise from the 21st to 25th March 2012.

ORGANISING AUTHORITY

The Organising Authority shall be Southport Yacht Club Inc. (SYC) located at Macarthur Parade, Main Beach Qld 4217. Phone (07) 5537 7030. Fax (07) 5537 7131.

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the current rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing 2009-2012 (RRS), the Prescriptions and Special Regulations of Yachting Australia (YA), the relevant One Design Class Rules (as applicable), and the IRC Rules parts 1, 2 and 3, except as any of these are altered by this Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions.

2 CHANGES TO THE RACING RULES OF SAILING

- 2.1 RRS 50.2 and 50.3: Fixed and retractable spinnaker poles and bowsprits will be permitted for the purpose of setting asymmetrical spinnakers.
- 2.2 RRS 51: A boat with movable or variable ballast that demonstrates compliance with the ballast leeward recovery requirements of Appendix A shall not use movable ballast to trim the boat fore and aft (refer IMS Rule 205.3 and Appendix 10).
- 2.3 RRS 78.1: Valid rating/class certificates must be included with the completed entry form.
- 2.4 The Race Committee may make measurement inspections at any time during the regatta. This alters RRS 78.3.

3 ADVERTISING

- 3.1 Advertising on a boat shall comply with the requirements of ISAF Regulation 20 (ISAF Advertising Code) for Category C.
- 3.2 The Organising Authority may reject an entry of a boat, which in its opinion is carrying advertising conflicting with that of the regatta sponsors. In any case of doubt, the Organising Authority should be consulted as soon as practicable.

4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

4.1 The regatta is open to:

- 4.1a **Performance Handicap System (PHS) Rated monohull and multihull boats** that comply with Yachting Australia Special Regulations Part 1 Category 5.
- 4.1b **IRC monohull boats that hold an IRC measurement certificate** should submit a copy with the entry form. Sub Divisions may be made based on numbers of IRC boats.
- 4.1c **Trailable Monohulls** that comply with Part 1 Category 6 up to 8m in length.
- 4.1d **Sportsboats** with a current SMS rating certificate that comply with Part 1 Category 6.
- 4.1e **Cruising Monohull and Multihull** boats that comply with Yachting Australia Special Regulations Part 1 Category 5.

- 4.1f **Off The Beach Catamarans** that comply with Yachting Australia Special Regulations Part 2 for Off-The-Beach Boats. Where the person-in-charge of a boat is under the age of eighteen (18) years, their Parent or Guardian shall also witness the Entry Form.
- 4.2 One-Design Classes and sub-divisions may be made or divisions may be joined, subject to the number of entries received and at the sole discretion of the Race Committee.
- 4.3 The person-in-charge of a boat shall be a current financial member of a Sailing Club affiliated with Yachting Australia, and an affiliated member of Yachting Australia, and the boat shall be listed on the register of vessels of a Sailing Club affiliated with Yachting Australia.
- 4.4 All boats shall hold a current Public Liability and Third Party Insurance Policy to the value of not less than AUD\$10 Million, which includes coverage for racing in the Regatta.
- 4.5 For all One Design Classes, a boat shall not change specifications after the close of entries. Any change to the hull, spars, sails, foils, ballast, equipment or any other factor which may affect the performance of the boat may be made only with the express written consent of the Race Committee

5 FEES AND DOCUMENTATION TO BE LODGED

- 5.1 Race Fees for the 2012 **XXXX** Sail Paradise Regatta shall be \$100, Off The Beach Cats, Etchells and Trailables block entered in their SYC offshore series the entry fee is \$50 all entries received after 1700hrs Friday 16th March 2012 will incur a \$50 late entry.
- 5.2 Entries shall be lodged with the Organising Authority **no later than 1700 hours on Friday 16th March 2012**. Late entries, accompanied by the additional, may be accepted after this date at the discretion of the Organising Authority. Eligible boats shall enter on the Entry Form (Attachment A), accompanied by the required Entry Fee and the following supplementary documentation, as applicable.
- 5.2a All boats shall comply with their relevant Special Regulations Form (Attachment B).
- 5.2b Crew Particulars shall be supplied on the Crew List form (Attachment C).
- 5.2c Class Measurement and Rating Certificates, as required
- 5.2d For a boat entered in a One-Design Class, the document(s) specified as required by its One-Design Rules and Regulations.

7 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 7.1 The Sailing Instructions will be available from the sailing office or online on Wednesday 14 March 2012

8 VENUE

- 8.1 The Regatta will be conducted from Southport Yacht Club (SYC) located at Macarthur Parade, Main Beach, Qld 4217. Phone: (+61) 7 5591 3500 Fax: (+61) 7 5532 7507.

9 COURSES

- 9.1 The courses shall be Triangle, Windward/Leeward, Ocean Marks and Passage Course configurations, as described in the Sailing Instructions.

10 HANDICAPPING

- 10.1 **Farr 30, SB3, Etchells** and other **One Design Classes** with the lowest elapsed time (after application of scoring penalties if any) will be scored first.
- 10.2 **Sportsboat** results will be calculated using each boat's SMS rating.
- 10.3 **IRC** results will be calculated using each boat's IRC rating.
- 10.4 **PHS** results will be calculated based on a Performance Handicap System (PHS) Time Correction Factor (TCF). The TCF that is determined and allocated by the Race Committee or its nominee will be performance-based and will be expressed as four (4) decimal places applied as a multiplier to elapsed times. The TCF may be altered between races, and will not be subject to protest, redress or dispute (amends RRS 60.1 and 62.1(a)) A list of TCF ratings will be posted on the notice board prior to briefing.

11 SCORING

- 11.1 For each Division, the Low Point Scoring System of Appendix A will apply.
- 11.2 Two races must be completed to constitute a Regatta. When all scheduled races have been sailed, a boat's Regatta score will be the total of her race scores discarding her worst score. If all scheduled races are not sailed, a boat's regatta score will be the total of her race scores.

12 ALTERNATIVE PENALTIES

- 12.1 The Two-Turns penalty (RRS 44.1) is changed to a One Turn penalty except for infringements that occur within three (3) boat lengths of a rounding mark.

13 BERTHING and LAUNCHING

- 13.1 It is highly recommended that all boats competing either berth or raft up along the beach at SYC Main Beach for the duration of the regatta, as this is where the social events will be held. SYC offers limited FREE berthing and rafting space to competing yachts from 10am Sunday 18 March, through to 10am Monday 26 March 2011. However, **BERTHING SPACE IS LIMITED** and we ask that you please arrange berthing allocations well in advance with the Marina Office: ph (07) 5591 3500. Rafting space for the Etchells, One Designs and the Trailables will be along the Beach in front of the club.

14 PRIZES

- 14.1 The **XXXX** Sail Paradise Trophy Presentation Dinner on will be staged on the evening of Sunday 25 March at Southport Yacht Club, Main Beach. This will include the presentation of the Sail Paradise Perpetual Trophy.
- 14.2 Prizes will be awarded to First, Second and Third in each Division or Sub Division for the regatta.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION

FOR SAIL PARADISE RACE WEEK

B.1 LAUNCHING

All boats must remain in the water overnight. There are launching facilities at Main Beach as well as Hollywell. The Main Beach facility has a boat ramp and marina while the facility located at 1 Marina Crescent, Hollywell has a crane, boat ramp and boatyard for trailers. Hollywell is approximately 4 Nautical Miles to the North of the Southport Yacht Club Main Beach clubhouse and easily accessible by the channels of the Broadwater. Trailer Sailors are encouraged to leave their boats in the water overnight at Main Beach. No overnight berthing will be permitted on the marina at the Hollywell Sailing Squadron. There is no Mast Stepping Gantry available. Competitors are advised to bring their own A-frame or Gin Pole for stepping of masts, although equipment may be available to be borrowed from Gold Coast Etchells Fleet Members.

B.2 TRAILERS

Trailers may be kept on the grounds immediately adjacent to the SYC Hollywell Sailing Squadron by arrangement with the Sailing Office on Telephone (07) 5537 7030. Trailers may also be kept at the Eastern side of the Southport Yacht Club Main Beach car park by arrangement with the Marina Manager, on Telephone (07) 5591 3500.

While all care is taken, no responsibility is assumed by Southport Yacht Club Inc for any property left on or around Club premises.

B.3 BERTHING

It is highly recommended that all boats competing either berth or raft up along the beach at SYC Main Beach for the duration of the regatta, as this is where the social events will be held. SYC offers limited FREE berthing and rafting space to competing yachts from 10am Saturday 9 January, through to 10am Friday 14 January 2010. However **BERTHING SPACE IS LIMITED** and we ask that you please arrange berthing allocations well in advance with the Marina Manager at the Marina Office: ph (07) 5591 8577. Rafting space will also be allocated by the Marina Office.

B.4 FACILITIES

Changing Rooms, Showers and Toilets are located at the Western Side of the Main Beach Clubhouse. Entry to the shower block requires an access card that also gives access to the Marina Security Doors. Access Cards are available from the Marina Office and require a security deposit, refundable upon return.

Pay-Phones are located next to the Shower Block gates and inside the Clubhouse directly opposite the Reception Desk. Facsimile services are available at the Reception Desk at standard rates.

The Bosun's Locker Chandlery is located at the Western side of the compound and stocks most common boat parts. There are several sailmakers located in close proximity to the Club.

B.5 HOSPITALITY

The Clubhouse has a Licensed Bar, a Restaurant offering a good range of food at affordable prices, and patio seating overlooking the Broadwater. In accordance with Queensland Liquor Licensing Regulations, all visitors will need to produce identification and sign in. This is only required once for each day you visit the Clubhouse.
