Notice of Race (NOR)

Amended 16 September 2022

1 RULES

- 1.2 The event is governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.3 National prescriptions do not apply.
- 1.3.1 The current version of the Para World Sailing Race Management Manual (RMM) will apply as amended by this Notice of Race.
- 1.3.2 World Anti-Doping Code Regulations will apply. Competitors are reminded of the World Sailing Rules and Regulations concerning the use of banned methods and substances, which are contained in the World Sailing Anti-Doping Code. Drug testing may take place during this event. Additional information is available at <https://www.wada-ama.org>
- 1.3.3 Hansa 303 Class Rules, except that C.6 Membership shall not apply. Membership of the Class Association is not required.
- 1.3.4 Support Person Regulations.
- 1.4 In all rules governing this event:
- 1.4.1 Both 'athlete' and 'competitor' mean a person competing or intending to compete in the event.
- 1.4.2 The notation [NP] in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).
- 1.4.3 The notation [SP] denotes a rule for which a standard penalty may be applied by the race committee or the technical committee without a hearing or a discretionary penalty applied by the International Jury with a hearing. This changes RRS 63.1 and A5.
- 1.4.4 The notation [DP] denotes a rule for which the penalty is at the discretion of the Protest Committee and may be less than disqualification. This changes RRS 64.1.

2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 2.1 The sailing instructions will be available after 1 November 2022 at southportyachtclub.com.au/2022-para-world-sailing-championships

3 COMMUNICATIONS

- 3.1 The online official notice board is located at southportyachtclub.com.au/2022-para-world-sailing-championships
- 3.2 [DP] While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

4.1 The event is open to all boats of the Hansa 303 class.

Virtus Eligibility - All athletes entering the event must appear on the Virtus Master List **no later than 5 September 2022**. It is strongly advised that applications for new athletes be

4.2 submitted to Virtus by July 2022. Athletes who do not appear on the Virtus Master List are not eligible for this event.

4.2.1 Hansa 303 One-Person (Male & Female International Championships) - Athletes shall be registered on the Virtus Master List International as Category II1 or II2.

4.2.2 Hansa 303 Two-Person (Open Gender International Championship) – Both athletes in each crew shall be registered on the Virtus Master List International as Category II1 or II2.

4.2.3 Hansa 303 Two-Person Supported (Open Gender International Championship) – One athlete in each crew shall be registered on the Virtus Master List International or have National eligibility as Category II1 or II2.

4.2.4 For information about Virtus eligibility, see www.virtus.sport/applying-for-athlete-eligibility

4.3 Competitors must be affiliated with a World Sailing Recognised National Authority. These are listed on the World Sailing website at www.sailing.org/about/members/mnas.

4.4 World Sailing Eligibility shall apply. Each competitor shall be registered as a World Sailing Sailor on the World Sailing website at www.sailing.org/sailors/isafsailor/index.php.

4.5 Eligible boats may enter by completing the online entry form and submitting it, together with the required fee, **no later than 12 October 2022**. See Event Fees Section 5.

4.6 Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the organising authority. Charter boats may not be available for late entrants.

4.7 To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.

5. EVENT FEES

The inaugural Championships will be held as part of the Virtus Oceania Asia Games from 5-11 November 2022. Competitors may participate and be included as an invited delegation to OA Games 2022 and have a full Games experience.

5.1 The Event Package* Per Person includes:

- Accommodation at 3+ Star for seven nights and all meals (from lunch on 5 November to breakfast on 12 November 2022).
- Transport to and from Airport, Competition and Training, Accreditation.
- Ticket to attend the Opening and Closing Ceremonies, including transport to and from the hotel to the venue.
- A welcome pack.
- Government taxes and the Virtus Capitation Fee for all members of the delegation (athletes and team officials).

5.1.1 Event Package exclusion: Where a Virtus nation exists and is coordinating a team, these costs do not include National Team Costs, uniform, and other travel expenses.

5.1.2 The cost in US dollars is outlined in the table below.

5.1.3 Athletes may enter one competition only.

- 6.1 For the Hansa 303 Two Person Supported International Championship, the crew member who is registered on the Virtus Master List as Category II1 or II2 shall control the helm at all times while racing.
- 6.2 World Sailing categorization will not apply

7 ADVERTISING

- 7.1 [NP] Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organising authority.
- 7.2 [NP] The organising authority may provide bibs that competitors are required to wear as permitted by the World Sailing Advertising Code.

9 EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

- 9.1 [DP] Boats shall be available for equipment inspection from 10am on 5 November.
- 9.2 Boats may be inspected at any time.

10 CLOTHING AND EQUIPMENT

- 10.1 Competitors shall provide their own sailing apparel and lifejacket.

11 VENUE

- 11.1 NoR Addendum 1 shows the plan of the event venue.
- 11.2 NoR Addendum 2 shows the location of the racing areas.

12 COURSES

- 12.1 The courses to be sailed will be described in the Sailing Instructions.

13 PENALTY SYSTEM

- 13.1 For all classes RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.
- 13.2 The intention is to appoint a Protest Committee.

14 SCORING

- 14.1 Four (4) races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 14.2 (a) When fewer than five (5) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- (b) When from five (5) to nine (9) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- (c) When ten (10) or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.

15 SUPPORT PERSON VESSELS

- 15.1 [DP] [NP] Support person vessels shall be marked with a number provided by the organising authority.

16 CHARTERED OR LOANED BOATS

- 16.1 A chartered or loaned boat may carry national letters or a sail number in contravention of her class rules, provided that the race committee has approved her sail identification before the first race.

Note: It is recommended that competitors using a chartered or loaned boat provide their own sails carrying the national letters and a valid sail number in their country.

17 BERTHING

- 17.1 [DP] [NP] Boats shall be kept in their assigned places while in the boat park or marina.

18 RISK STATEMENT

- 18.1 RRS 3 states: *'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.'* By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.

19 INSURANCE

- 19.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of AUD\$10 million per incident or the equivalent.

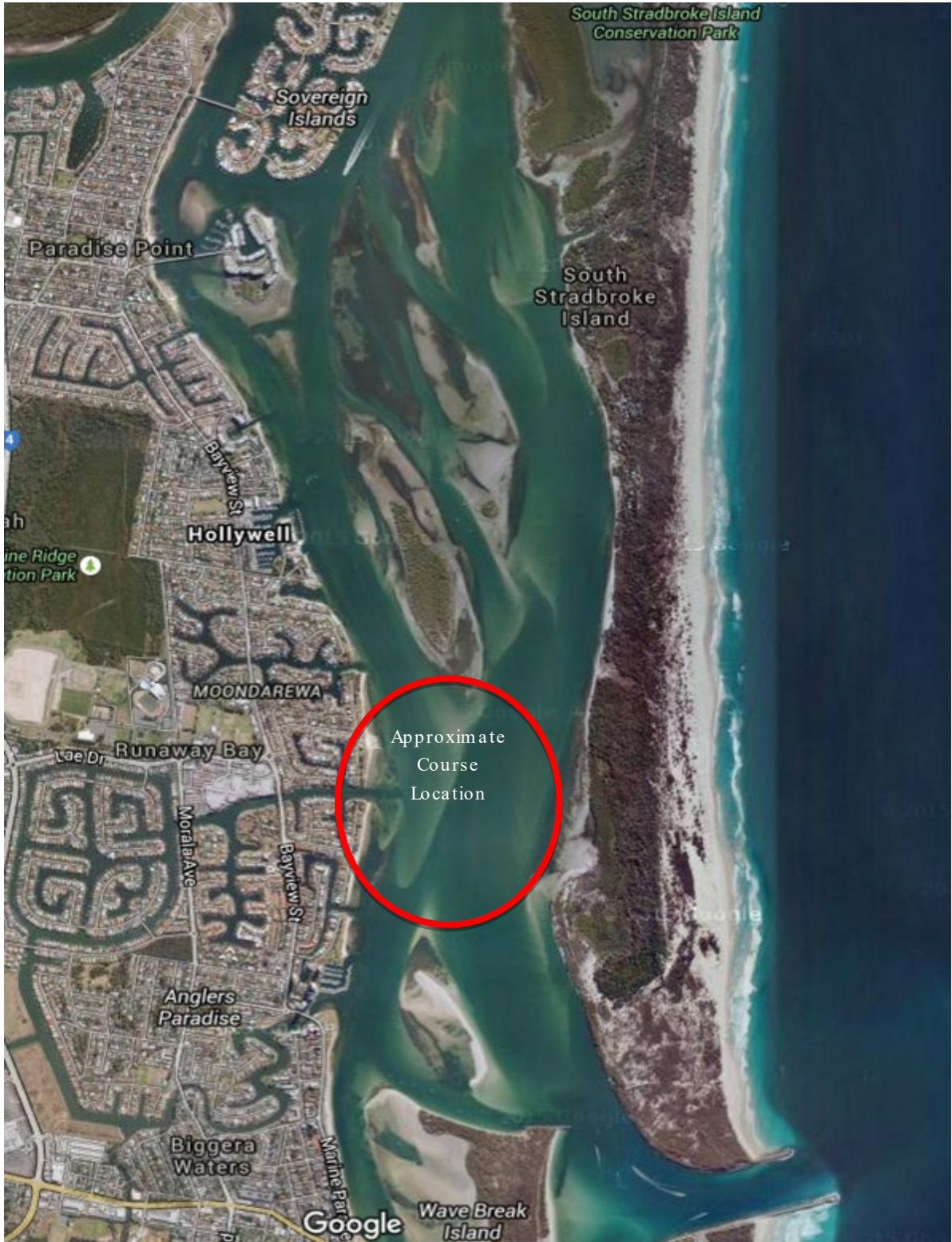

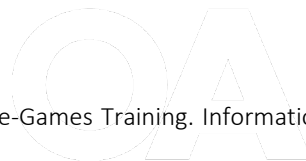

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS TO AUSTRALIA

It is the individual registrant's responsibility to ensure they have met any and all requirements to enter into Australia and to participate in the event.

10. Visa Requirements

Most countries require a Visa to enter Australia. OAGOC will be in contact with each individual country, Virtus Member Nations and Head of Delegations to ensure all registrants are aware of the visa application process for their Nation. All attendees must comply with the Australia Government and Queensland Government entry requirements.

VIRTUS ELIGIBILITY

11. Eligibility & Virtus Master List

All athletes entering the event must appear on the Virtus Master List no later than 12 October 2022.

It is strongly advised that applications for **New Athletes** should be **submitted to Virtus** as **early as possible**. Athletes who do not appear on the Virtus Master List are not eligible for this event.

According to Virtus Rules and Policies, all OAGames 2022 sports and demonstration sports are open to I11 category: athletes with an intellectual impairment. Subject to viability some sports may include competition categories for I1-2 (Significant Intellectual Disability) and / or I13 (athletes with high functioning Autism).

ANTI-DOPING

Virtus is a signatory to the World Anti-Doping Code as the basis for the fight against doping in sport. We treat the issue of doping very seriously. Competitors, coaches, member organisations, event organisers and Sport Technical Officers should read and understand the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) procedures carefully and ensure they are upheld at every opportunity.

12. Doping Controls
